Agenda & Discussion Points:

1) Confirmation of the minutes of the 21st Meeting of CDC held on 15th September 2025:

The minutes of the 21st CDC meeting, held on 15th September 2025, were unanimously confirmed after being circulated to all members.



2) Introduction of the new programmes from the academic year 2026-2027:

The committee reviewed proposals for six new programmes, including details on intake, eligibility, fees, and syllabus.

The following Programmes were granted formal approval to commence in the Academic Year 2026-2027:

Sr. No.	Program	Intake
1	BSc in Business Analytics	60
2	BSc in Robotics and Intelligent System	60
3	M.Sc. Biotechnology	20

The proposals for B.Sc. Defence Science & Technology, B.Sc. Aerospace Science & Technology, and B.Sc. Synthetic Biology & Biodefence needed further refinement. The committee advised the coordinator of these programmes to restructure the curriculum to strictly align with NEP requirements and conduct a feasibility study regarding infrastructure and market demand before re-submission.

3) Discussions about new MOUs signed by TCSC [BOAT and Sanskrit University]:

The committee was briefed on two strategic partnerships:

Board of Apprenticeship Training (BOAT): Established to facilitate On-the-Job Training (OJT) and internships, ensuring students meet NEP credit requirements and improve employability.

Central Sanskrit University, Delhi: An MOU was signed to establish a Center for Sanskrit Learning (CSL). This center will offer certificate courses and explore introducing Sanskrit language as an Ability Enhancement Course (AEC) from the next academic year.

4) Planning for and execution of the curriculum enrichment and academic integrity in the College [Skill based programmes, certificate courses, ethics, morals, punctuality etc.]

Members reviewed the integration of add-on Skill-based Certificate Courses as a compulsory component for the learners as part of Curriculum enrichment which are run by in-house department as well as by industry experts.

5) Review of the Teaching Pedagogies implemented under NEP [regular learners, slow and advanced learners]:

The committee reviewed the differentiated teaching strategies implemented across departments:

Regular Learners: Utilization of Blended Learning, integrating digital tools with traditional classroom teaching.

Slow Learners: Implementation of structured Remedial Teaching sessions.

Advanced Learners: Encouragement to pursue Swayam/NPTEL certifications, research projects, and competitive examination coaching.



6) Measures for enhancement of the faculty and learners [FDP, Orientation, Refresher, Faculty Exchange, Student Exchange, Internships, OJT etc.]

Ongoing initiatives for professional and academic growth of the faculty & learners were noted:

Faculty: Active participation in FDPs, Orientations, and Refresher courses.

Students: Regular career guidance, technical & interpersonal skill workshops, OJT and field projects integrated as part of the NEP curriculum.

7) Review of the Examination reforms [additional exam, ATKT, Telegram Channel]

The Controller of Examinations briefed the committee on the New ATKT Rules of the University of Mumbai as per the Circular No. AAMS_UGS/ICC/2025-26/40 dated 3rd June, 2025.

The committee unanimously resolved to adopt the University's new ATKT rules. Consequently, the previously established 'N' KT rule will be revoked to ensure full compliance with University standards.

8) Research and Innovations as a key factor for NEP and NAAC reforms [research papers by the faculty and learners, projects, funding, seed money, conferences, seminars, workshops etc.]

The committee noted the progress in faculty and student publications, patent filings, and research projects.

9) Community Engagement, Extension and Outreach activities [Programmes done for the benefit of the society]

Detailed reports were shared regarding outreach activities and social initiatives conducted as part of the "Community Engagement" requirement under the NEP framework.

10) College Achievements [curricular, co – curricular, extra – curricular and extra – mural activities]

A summary of the institution's achievements over the past six months was presented, covering curricular, co-curricular, extra-curricular, and extra-mural activities.

11) Any other matter with the permission of the chair:

The students shared their On-the-Job Training experiences. While noting initial challenges in securing internships, they highlighted significant gains in industry exposure and the acquisition of new technical skills.
