The Committee deliberated on the implementation of the 4th Year Honours with Papers & Research programs for the Academic Year 2026–27. In alignment with the guidelines issued by the University of Mumbai, the following resolutions were passed:

Honours with research:

Sr. No.	Program	Eligibility
1	B.Sc. (Hons. with Research) in Chemistry	A Learner must be successful in the three-year B.Sc. in Chemistry (Major) under NEP 2020 from recognized university with 120 to 132 credits and Minimum CGPA of 7.50



2	B.Sc. (Hons. with Research) in Zoology	A Learner must be successful in the three-year B.Sc. in Zoology (Major) under NEP 2020 from recognized university with 120 to 132 credits and Minimum CGPA of 7.50
3	B.Sc. (Hons. with Research) in Physics	A Learner must be successful in the three-year B.Sc. in Physics (Major) under NEP 2020 from recognized university with 120 to 132 credits and Minimum CGPA of 7.50

The curriculum structure & Intake will be as mandated in the guidelines issued by the University of Mumbai.

4) Paper Pattern & Evaluation for all PG & Honours programmes

CIA : SEE (50:50):

The members were briefed on the revised evaluation scheme for all Post-Graduate (PG) and Honours programs as per the new guidelines issued by the University of Mumbai, effective from the upcoming academic session.

A 50:50 distribution between Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) and Semester End Examination (SEE) was approved.

5) Budget for A.Y. 2026-2027 & Income Expenditure Statement for A.Y. 2025-26:

The Committee reviewed and approved the Audited Accounts Statement for the Academic Year 2025–2026.

It was noted that the proposed Budget for 2026–2027 is pending approval by the Finance Committee. Once finalized, the document will be circulated among the members.

6) Approval of Annual Institutional Development Plan for the academic year 2026-2027:

The IQAC Coordinator presented the Institutional Development Plan (IDP) for 2026–2027, framed within the context of the Five-Year Perspective Plan (2024–2029).

Key focus areas were highlighted, specifically regarding the integration of National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 mandates, including multidisciplinary approaches, skill-based enhancements & infrastructural development.

7) Any other matter with the permission of the chair:

1) Change in the nomenclature of Under Graduate Programmes:

B.Com. (Honours) to B.Com. (Professional Accounting & Auditing)

The college has been offering a three-year B.Com (Honours) degree program (UGC Approved) since the academic year 2020-2021. However, as per the new NEP 2020



framework, an "Honours" nomenclature is typically associated with the completion of a four-year (8 semesters) program of study. To avoid the confusion & in light of these regulatory shifts, the Board has decided to change its nomenclature to B.Com. (Professional Accounting & Auditing).

Resolution: "It was resolved to approve the Nomenclature of the programme B.Com. (Honours) to B.Com. (Professional Accounting & Auditing) from the Academic Year 2026-2027".

B.Sc. (Actuarial Science) to B.Sc. (Actuarial Science & Quantitative Finance)

The rationale behind the change in nomenclature includes, evolving industry requirements, increasing competition, and to better align with current trends.

Resolution: "It was resolved to approve the Nomenclature of the programme B.Sc. (Actuarial Science) to B.Sc. (Actuarial Science & Quantitative Finance) from the Academic Year 2026-2027".

2) The Chair shared several institutional updates and milestones achieved by the College:

1. The Junior College successfully secured an A+ Grade in the SQAAC Accreditation for the Academic Year 2024–2025.
2. Four learners from B.Sc. (Physics) ranked in the top 1% nationwide in the IAPT-NGPE 2026 Examination (out of 3,092 candidates). Notably, two of these students received direct admission offers for the Integrated Ph.D. program at the S.N. Bose National Centre for Basic Sciences, Kolkata.
3. The College celebrated International Women's Day by felicitating women achievers from diverse professional fields.
4. It was reported that 90% of the faculty have completed Capacity Building programs and FDPs organized by the Maharashtra State Faculty Development Academy (MSFDA).
5. The Committee was updated that the AQAR submission for the last two years remains pending due to the NAAC portal being closed and the absence of fresh guidelines from the council.
6. Following the declaration of results, the admission process for the Second and Third Year of Degree programs is nearing completion.
