Minutes:

The 3rd meeting of College Development Committee commenced at 8:00 a.m. in the Conference Room of TCSC in presence of the listed members. Principal welcomed everyone and asked Dr. Vinit Vaidya (Staff Secretary) to head the meeting.

Shri. V. K. Singh, Shri. Jitendra Singh, Mr. Vijay Nair, Mr. Raja Shah, Dr. A. K. Singh & Dr. Ravish R. Singh had conveyed about their Leave of Absence due to some prior commitments.

Agenda wise points were discussed as below:

1. Confirmation of minutes of earlier meeting:

Minutes of the earlier meeting of CDC held on 22nd January 2019 at 11.00 a.m. in the Conference Room were confirmed by the members unanimously.

2. Conferment of Autonomy by University Grants Commission (UGC):

Dr. Vinit Vaidya informed the house that Thakur College of Science & Commerce has been conferred with Autonomous Status by UGC, New Delhi for period of 10 years w.e.f. academic year 2019 - 2020 and the College has decided to go for progressive Autonomy as per the Gazette of India Part 3 – Section 4 dated 12th February 2018 i.e. only for first year level for all the regular & professional, undergraduate and postgraduate programmes in faculty of Science & Commerce; which everyone is agreed to.

3. Formation of Board of Studies, Academic Council and Governing Council:

Dr. Vinit Vaidya further informed the members that:

1. As per Gazette of India Part 3 – Section 4 dated 12th February 2018; TCSC is supposed to constitute Board of Studies, Academic Council & Governing Council with nomination from the Parent University, State Government of Maharashtra and UGC.

- 2. The letters and respective reminders were sent to concerned authorities regarding the same. The nominations from concerned authorities were delayed. Hence, TCSC has constituted ad-hoc Board of Studies in all the programmes / courses and the meeting of the same was conducted on Sunday, 25th August 2019 from 10.00 a.m. in the Conference Room of the College. The curriculum, evaluation pattern and evaluation methods were discussed and finalized during this meeting.
- 3. Now, TCSC is in receipt of the University Nominees for various subjects nominated by the Honourable Vice Chancellor, University of Mumbai. Hence, the College is in process of constitution of Board of Studies for each programme / course as per the given composition.
- 4. TCSC has planned to conduct the meetings of all the constituted Board of Studies on Saturday, 23rd November 2019, 10:30 a.m. onwards for discussion of: (a) 20% change in the syllabus (b) Evaluation Pattern (C) Evaluation Methods
- 5. TCSC is planning to make skill oriented courses compulsory for learners. Dr. Sunil Mantri stated that University has given limit of 120 Credits and College should not go beyond 120 Credits. At that time Dr. M. A. Farooqui stated that the minimum limit prescribed by the UGC is 120 credits. Over and above can be made mandatory but not to be counted for evaluation for granting of Degree.

4. Curriculum, Evaluation pattern & Evaluation methods under Autonomy:

It was decided to follow curriculum of the University of Mumbai for this Academic year for F.Y. but there is going to be 20% change in syllabus from Academic year 2020 - 2021 so that the teachers get time to design the syllabus as well as requisite training.

The evaluation pattern followed by all the programmes and courses is 40 marks Internal Examination and 60 Marks External Examination. Pattern for Internal Examination is as follow:

8. New Programmes (started & applied for):

Dr. Vinit Vaidya informed that the College had applied in academic year 2018 -2019 to start new programmes:

- 1. B. Sc. (Data Science),
- 2. B. Sc. (Actuarial Science) and
- **3. M. Com. (Advanced Accountancy)** whereby permission is sorted from the University of Mumbai and the courses were started from the academic year 2019 2020.

The number of students enrolled for B. Sc. (Data Science) is 54 while number of students enrolled for M. Com. (Advanced Accountancy) is 60. The programme of B. Sc. (Actuarial Science) could not be started as no student applied for the programme due to requirement of very high percentage [70% aggregate marks with 85 marks in Mathematics in H. S. C. Examination].

Dr. Sunil Mantri suggested changing the norms under Autonomy and conducting Entrance Examination along with Interviews for the professional programmes. The same was seconded by Dr. M. A. Farooqui. Hence, it was decided to have Entrance Examination for new professional programmes as well as some of the existing programmes such as B.M.S. and B.A.F. to maintain the quality and standard of the students.

College has proposed for the following programmes to be started from the academic year 2020 - 2021:

(a) M. Sc. (Botany) (b) M. Sc. (Zoology) and (c) Ph. D. Lab Recognition – Physics and Zoology
